








National Highway Freight Network

Eligible Project Costs


- Development Phase Activities
 - Planning, Feasibility Analysis, Revenue Forecasting, Environmental Review, Preliminary Engineering, Design Work, and Other Pre-Construction Activities.
- Construction Activities
 - New Construction, Reconstruction, Rehabilitation, Property or Equipment Acquisition, Environmental Mitigation, Construction Contingencies, and Operational Improvements.

*USDOT is seeking to use INFRA funding on projects that result in construction. P3 assessments for projects in the development phase are also eligible costs.





Project Size




\$100M minimum total future cost in Florida

Cost Share and Obligation Requirements




Previously incurred expenses cannot count towards cost share



INFRA Grant - FDOT Timeline

Dec

 FDOT Freight and Multimodal Operations Office and District Freight Coordinators (DFCs) to review updated criteria and projects for eligibility

Jan

- Jan 14 Kickoff webinar to share FDOT's process and worksheet template
- DFCs to work with stakeholders to collect all INFRA candidate project worksheets
- Jan 28 Last day to submit INFRA grant candidate project worksheets for consideration

Feb

- Feb 1 FDOT freight team to review scoring, determine top statewide priorities, and get FDOT leadership buy-in
- Top 3 INFRA candidate projects to prepare full INFRA grant applications
- Feb 11 Top 3 projects submit completed applications for budget approval

Mar

March 4 – Applications must be submitted by 8:00 p.m. EST on Grants.gov


