

1 **ORDINANCE SUMMARY**

2 No current regulations apply to temporary portable storage containers within Lake County. This
3 ordinance would define what temporary portable storage containers are as well as regulate temporary
4 portable storage containers, including the location, duration, and numbers of containers allowed on
5 properties within Lake County.

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13 **AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF LAKE COUNTY,**
14 **FLORIDA; AMENDING LAKE COUNTY CODE, APPENDIX E, LAKE COUNTY LAND**
15 **DEVELOPMENT REGULATIONS, CHAPTER II, ENTITLED “DEFINITIONS”, TO CREATE**
16 **DEFINITIONS RELATED TO TEMPORARY PORTABLE STORAGE CONTAINERS, AND**
17 **AMENDING CHAPTER III, LAKE COUNTY LAND DEVELOPMENT REGULATIONS, ENTITLED**
18 **“ZONING DISTRICT REGULATIONS”, TO CREATE SECTION 3.14.00, ENTITLED**
19 **“TEMPORARY PORTABLE STORAGE CONTAINERS”; PROVIDING FOR INCLUSION IN THE**
20 **CODE; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR FILING WITH THE**
21 **DEPARTMENT OF STATE; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.**

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23 **WHEREAS,** the Lake County Board of County Commissioners (the “Board”) determines that it is
24 in the best interest of its residents, business and visitors to enact sufficient zoning regulations to ensure
25 their health, safety and welfare in regards to temporary portable storage containers; and

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27 **WHEREAS,** the Board desires to establish regulations for temporary portable storage containers
28 that are streamlined and appropriate for Lake County; and

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30 **WHEREAS,** the Planning & Zoning Board, in its capacity as the Local Planning Agency, considered
31 this ordinance and recommended approval at a properly advertised public hearing on
32 _____, 2015; and

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34 **WHEREAS,** on _____, 2015, this Ordinance was heard at a public hearing
35 before the Lake County Board of County Commissioners;

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37 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the Board of County Commissioners of Lake County,
38 Florida, as follows:

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40 **Section 1. Recitals.** The foregoing recitals are true and correct and incorporated herein by
41 reference.

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43 **Section 2. Amendment.** Lake County Code, Appendix E, Lake County Land Development
44 Regulations, Chapter II, entitled “Definitions”, is hereby amended to read as follows (changes are shown

utilizing ~~striketrough~~ for deletions and underline for additions to existing Code sections. The notation “* * *” indicates that all preceding or subsequent text remains unchanged):

Chapter II Definitions.

Structure, Temporary. A structure installed, used, or erected for a period less than one hundred and eighty (180) days.

Temporary Portable Storage Containers. Any temporary structure that is reusable, enclosed, semi-closed or open vessel, cargo container or truck trailer which is used for the storage of freight, articles, goods, solid waste, personal belongings, commodities, or the like.

Section 3. Amendment and Creation. Lake County Code, Appendix E, Lake County Land Development Regulations, Chapter III, entitled “Zoning District Regulations”, is hereby amended to create Section 3.14.00, to be entitled “Temporary Portable Storage Containers”, and to read as follows:

Section 3.14.00. Temporary Portable Storage Containers

3.14.01 Purpose and Intent. Temporary Portable Storage Containers (TPSC) are permitted in a manner that is safe and compatible with adjacent surrounding uses in compliance with this Section.

3.14.02 Prohibitions. Any TPSC exceeding twenty (20) feet in length shall be prohibited in residential zoning districts.

3.14.03 Criteria for Temporary Portable Storage Containers. A TPSC may be permitted in any zoning district and is not subject to zoning permit or building permit requirements, provided it meets the following criteria:

A. **Number of Units.** For parcels or lots one (1) acre or less in size, a maximum of one (1) TPSC shall be permitted. For parcels or lots greater than one (1) acre in size, a maximum of three (3) TPSC shall be permitted.

B. **Placement/Location.** The following criteria shall apply to the location and placement of a TPSC:

1. **A TPSC shall be prohibited on a vacant parcel or lot.**
2. **TPSCs shall not be stacked.**
3. **A TPSC shall be located a minimum of five (5) feet from any property line and/or structure.**
4. **A TPSC shall not be permitted within a required landscape area, buffer area, areas that are considered environmentally sensitive or within easements.**

5. A TPSC shall not be permitted in a manner that impairs a motor vehicles operator’s view of other vehicles, bicycle or pedestrian ways, entering or exiting a sidewalk or right-of-way, or in a manner that obstructs the flow of pedestrian or vehicular traffic.

C. Duration. TPSCs may remain on a parcel or lot for a maximum of ninety (90) days during a calendar year. Time periods set forth in this section may be extended and granted by the County Manager or designee, provided the applicant can show good cause. Good cause shall mean emergencies and situations where there exists a reasonable risk or threat to life and property damage if the extension is not granted. Any extension granted shall not exceed one hundred eighty (180) days.

3.14.04 Exemptions. The following shall be exempt from the provisions of this Section:

- A. Structures such as storage sheds that are assembled on site or pre-manufactured, roll off trash bins, trucks, or trailers.
- B. Properly permitted businesses that sell, rent or lease TPSCs.
- C. A TPSC used in conjunction with an agricultural use on land classified as agricultural by the Lake County Property Appraiser pursuant to Chapter 193, Florida Statutes.

Section 4. Severability. If any section, sentence, clause or phrase of the Ordinance is held to be invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, then said holding shall in no way affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

Section 5. Inclusion in the Code. It is the intent of the Board of County Commissioners that the provisions of this Ordinance shall become and be made a part of the Lake County Code and that the sections of this Ordinance may be renumbered or re-lettered and the word “ordinance” may be changed to “section”, “article” or such other appropriate word or phrase in order to accomplish such intentions.

Section 6. Filing with the Department of State. The clerk shall be and is hereby directed forthwith to send a copy of this Ordinance to the Secretary of State for the State of Florida in accordance with Section 125.66, Florida Statutes.

Section 7. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective as provided for by law.
