Section 10.01.06, Lake County Code, Appendix E, Land Section 2. 1 Development Regulations, entitled Backyard Chickens, is hereby amended to read as follows: 2 3 4 10.01.06 Backyard Chickens. ;p0; General Requirements. Chickens, other than roosters, shall be allowed for personal use as an accessory use within the Agriculture (A), Agriculture 5 Residential (AR), Ranchette District (RA), Rural Residential (R-1), Estate Residential (R-2), 6 Medium Residential (R-3), Medium Suburban Residential (R-4), Urban Residential (R-6), Mixed 7 8 Residential (R-7), and Mixed Home Residential (RM) Districts subject to the following 9 requirements. A. Any person keeping, harboring, raising or maintaining chickens as an accessory to an 10 occupied dwelling unit shall be subject to the following restrictions: 11 No more than five (5) chickens may be kept; 12 1. 2. Slaughtering of chickens is prohibited; 13 3. Chickens must be secured within the chicken coop or fenced enclosure at all times; 14 All feed and other items associated with the keeping of chickens that are likely to 4. 15 attract or to become infested with rodents or other pests shall be kept in a rodent and 16 pest-proof container; 17 No manure shall be allowed to accumulate on the floor of the coop or ground. A fly-18 5. tight bin for storage of manure shall be utilized; the size shall be sufficient to contain 19 all accumulations of manure. The fly-tight bin shall be kept at least twenty (20) feet 20 away from all property; and 21 Composting of chicken manure shall be allowed in an enclosed bin. The composting 22 6. bin shall be kept at least twenty (20) feet away from all property lines. 23 B. Chicken coop or fenced enclosure used to house chickens. Any chicken coop or fenced 24 enclosure used to house chickens shall: 25 1. Not be located in the front or side yards; and 26 Be set back a minimum of twenty (20) feet from all property lines. 27 2. 28 Section 3. Severability. If any section, sentence, clause, or phrase or word of this 29 Ordinance is for any reason held or declared to be invalid, unconstitutional, inoperative or void by 30 any court of competent jurisdiction, then said holding shall in no way affect the validity of the 31 remaining portion of this Ordinance; and it shall be construed to have been the Commissioners' 32 intent to pass this Ordinance without such unconstitutional, invalid or inoperative part therein; and 33 the remainder of this Ordinance, after the exclusion of such part or parts shall be deemed and held 34 to be valid, as if such parts had not been included herein; or if this Ordinance or any provisions 35 thereof shall be held inapplicable to any person, groups of persons, property, kind of property, 36 circumstances or set of circumstances, such holding shall not affect the applicability thereof to any 37 other person, property or circumstances. 38 39
