## **Summary of Ordinance**

The purpose of this Ordinance is to amend Chapter II, Lake County Code, Appendix E, Land Development Regulations, entitled *Definitions* and Section 14.19.00, entitled *Open Air Vendors*, to address recent code enforcement observation and trends in roadside open air vendors.

Changes are shown as follows: Strikethrough for deletions and Underline for additions to existing Code sections. The notation "\* \* \*" shall mean that all preceding or subsequent text remains unchanged (excluding any renumbering or relettering that might be needed).

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## ORDINANCE 2025-

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF LAKE COUNTY, FLORIDA; AMENDING CHAPTER II, LAKE COUNTY CODE, APPENDIX E, LAND DEVELOPMENT REGULATIONS, ENTITLED *DEFINITIONS*, REGARDING OPEN AIR VENDORS; AMENDING SECTION 14.19.00, LAKE COUNTY CODE APPENDIX E, LAND DEVELOPMENT REGULATIONS, ENTITLED *OPEN AIR VENDORS*; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR INCLUSION IN THE CODE; PROVIDING FOR FILING WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF STATE; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

**WHEREAS**, the Lake County Land Development Regulations allow for temporary open air vendors in certain zoning districts upon approval by the County Manager or designee; and

**WHEREAS,** on January 25, 2013, Ordinance 2013-5, was adopted to update the requirements for open air vendors and special events; and

**WHEREAS,** based on recent Lake County Office of Code Enforcement observation and investigation, further updates to Section 14.19.00 are required to expand the definition of Open Air Vendor to include vehicles that provide mobile commercial services, to require property owners to provide sufficient parking, bathroom facilities, driveway access, and to provide an exception for certain community events; and

**WHEREAS,** the Board of County Commissioners has determined that adopting this Ordinance is in the best interests of the residents of Lake County, Florida.

**NOW THEREFORE,** be it ordained by the Board of County Commissioners of Lake County, Florida, as follows:

**Section 1.** <u>Legislative Findings of Fact</u>. The foregoing recitals are hereby adopted as legislative findings of the Board of County Commissioners and are ratified and confirmed as being true and correct and are hereby made a specific part of this Ordinance upon adoption hereof.

**Section 2.** <u>Amendment.</u> Chapter II, Lake County Code, Appendix E, Land Development Regulations, entitled *Definitions*, is hereby amended to read as follows:

The purpose of this Section is to provide for the regulation of Open aAir A. 20 \*Vendors, which are only allowed in the nNeighborhood eCommercial "C-1," eCommunity eCommercial district "C-2," eEmployment eCenter dDistrict "C-3," 21 <u>PPlanned eCommercial dDistrict "CP," Light Industrial dDistrict "LM," heavy</u> 22 23 industrial dDistrict "HM," pPlanned iIndustrial dDistrict "MP," and eCommunity 24 fFacility dDistrict "CFD." 25 26 B. Applicability. This section shall apply to all oOpen aAir vendors within the county, 27 with the exception of roadside stands selling produce raised or produced on the farmland of which they are a part and are composed of a minimum structure. This Section is only 28 29 intended to regulate the zoning and safe access requirements for all types of Open Air Vendors and does not provide for any further regulation of mobile food dispensing 30 31 vehicles. Mobile food dispensing vehicles are regulated by Section 509.102, Florida 32 Statutes. 33 34 C. Requirements. The <u>eC</u>ounty <u>mM</u>anager or designee may approve the sale of 35 merchandise, commercial services, or food and issue a permit to the owner of the property 36 that will host the Open Air Vendor allowing for a period not to exceed two non-37 consecutive thirty (30) day periods per calendar year upon receipt of the following: 38 39 1. A valid business tax receipt: 40 2. A letter from the owner of the property upon which the vendor proposes to locate 41 giving permission to locate on said property and indicating that sanitary facilities 42 shall be available to vendor customers. 43 44 2.1. A site plan showing that sanitary facilities shall be available to vendor customers. 45

3.2. A site plan showing the proposed location of the Open Air \(\psi \)Vendor\_, that depicts proof of sufficient parking to accommodate customers. Parking is prohibited on

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public right of way or publicly owned property. Parking shall not interrupt the normal flow of traffic. The site plan must also show clearly defined driveway access, with apron, and shall have an approved right-of-way utilization permit and, if required by County Manager or designee, provide a \$1,000.00 bond. The bond shall be issued through an acceptable surety authorized to do business in the State of Florida and in a form approved by the County Attorney's office. Open air vendors shall be located only in areas of commercial zoning The vendor stall or area shall be placed only in areas where there is sufficient parking to accommodate customers, and shall not be located in an area that will interrupt the normal flow of traffic.

3. Permits will not be issued for less than thirty (30) day increments. Only two thirty (30) day permits will be issued per property per calendar year.

4. Documentation that the additional standards of subsection D. have been met, as applicable.

D. Exception. Open Air Vendors that provide food within an established residential subdivision or commerce park that are intended to serve residents or employees, but that do not remain overnight, are not required to obtain an Open Air Vendor permit.

**E.** Additional Standards.

1. All pyrotechnical items sold must be consistent with state laws regulating same and all persons selling pyrotechnical merchandise must be licensed by the state fire <u>marshall</u>.

2. The location and sales of proposed sale of pyrotechnical items must be approved by the county fire marshall.

3. Electrical hook-up or fixtures shall meet the county adopted national electrical code.

**Section 4.** <u>Inclusion in Code.</u> It is the intent of the Board of County Commissioners that the provisions of this Ordinance shall become and be made a part of the Lake County Code and that the sections of this Ordinance may be renumbered or relettered and the word "ordinance" may be changed to "section", "article", or such other appropriate word or phrase to accomplish such intentions.

 Section 5. Severability. If any section, sentence, clause, or phrase or word of this Ordinance is for any reason held or declared to be invalid, unconstitutional, inoperative or void by any court of competent jurisdiction, then said holding shall in no way affect the validity of the remaining portion of this Ordinance; and it shall be construed to have been the Commissioners' intent to pass this Ordinance without such unconstitutional, invalid or inoperative part therein; and the remainder of this Ordinance, after the exclusion of such part or parts shall be deemed and held to be valid, as if such parts had not been included herein; or if this Ordinance or any provisions thereof shall be held inapplicable to any person, groups of persons, property, kind of property,
