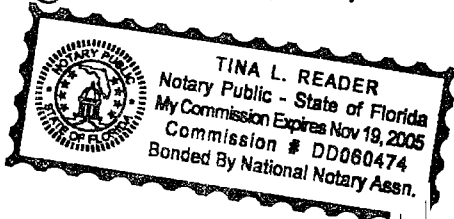

NOTICE OF AGENCY ACTION TAKEN BY THE ST. JOHNS RIVER WATER MANAGEMENT DISTRICT

Notice is given that the following permit was issued on April 2, 2002: Lannar Homes, Inc., 4902 Essenhower Blvd., Suite 289, Tampa, FL 33634, permit #40-059-19451-8. The project is located in Lake County, Sections 5, 8, Township 23 South, Range 26 East. The permit authorizes modification and operation of a surface water management system consisting of 16.77-acre single-family residential subdivision to be known as Legends Phase III. The surface water management system includes 66 single-family residential lots, associated internal roadways and stormwater conveyance system. No impacts to wetlands or surface waters are authorized by this permit. This project is a hard locked basin.

The file(s) containing the application for the above

listed permit is available for inspection Monday through Friday except for legal holidays, 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. at the St. Johns River Water Management District (District) Headquarters, Hwy 100 W. Failure to file a petition within this time period shall constitute a waiver of any right(s) such person(s) may have to request an administrative determination (hearing) under section 120.57, F.S., concerning the subject permit. Permit applications under the General section beginning with "400" are Noticed General Permit applications. For these applications, any objections as to whether the proposed activity qualifies for the requested noticed general permit must be made in writing and filed with (received by) the District Clerk, P.O. Box 1429, Palatka, Florida, 32178-1429, on or before 14 days from date of posting of the notice receipt of application. The posting date is shown on the bottom of Section C in the shaded block designated as "For Agency Use Only", and adjacent to "Date to be posted". If no timely objections are received, District staff will notify the applicant within 30 days from the date of receipt of notice of intent, whether the proposed activity qualifies for the requested Noticed General permit. If timely objections are received, the procedures applicable to an Individual permit application will be followed in determining compliance with the terms of the Noticed General Permit. As compared to Notice General permit procedures, procedures for Individual permits require that the District Governing Board act on (approve or deny) the application.
